## What is the McKinney Vento Act?

The McKinney-Vento Act was originally part of the "No Child Left Behind" Legislation. Reauthorized in 2015 by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) which went into effect on October 1, 2016.



## Who is eligible for the McKinney Vento Act?

Students who lack a fixed, regular and adequate night-time residence. Including the following:

- -Shared housing due to loss of housing or economic hardship or other similar reason
- -Living in cars, parks, public spaces, hotels or motels, emergency and transitional shelters, trailer parks or campgrounds, or other facility not designed for regular sleeping accommodations.
- -Unaccompanied homeless youth and migratory children living in the above circumstances












### **Impact of Homelessness on Students**











Between 49% and 86% of homeless students graduated in four years based on the data reported by states. California reported 70% graduation rate based on cohort of 34,470 students.

### **District Liaison Role**

- Consistent communication with Registrar's at all school sites concerning student enrollment/needs/data collection.
- Provide presentations to faculty, clinical team and parent groups.
- Streamline the processes for all stakeholders.
- Attend quarterly Santa Clara County Office Of Education Meetings and bi-weekly community collaborative meetings. Complete reports.
- Advocate, coordinate and provide case management for McKinney Vento families.
- Assist with special programs supporting McKinney families (grants, donations etc)







## McKinney Vento Act/Foster Youth Key Provisions

- -Enroll immediately, even without the required paperwork.
- -School placement in the student's best interest. May attend school of origin or the school where they are temporarily residing.
- -Transportation services (bus passes, case by case for Foster Youth).
- -Access to all school & district services.
- -Appeal decisions regarding enrollment and services.

# What is the process for McKinney Vento students at MVLA high school district?

- 1) Registrar's Office upon enrollment. Housing situation is disclosed and Student Housing Questionnaire is completed.
- 2) Self-disclosure to School Personnel (Administration, Teacher, Counselor or Therapist). Please have family complete a SHQ.Family will be contacted by Support Services Specialist and referred to "Family Advocacy Services-Bill Wilson Center" for case management services within 2 business days.
- 3) Recertification is needed every new school year.



### **District Resources**

- 1) Prioritize families for special programs (including but not limited to E3 Grants, School Supplies, Gift Cards, Student Club Programs etc)
- 2) Year round collaboration with community agencies (ex: Hopes Corner, Safe Parking Lots)
- 3) School Onsite Programs: CHAC Counseling, Uplift Services, Substance Use Treatment Services, Health Van, A La Carte Food Van and Family Advocacy Services (Bill Wilson Center) and more.
