



- Middle College: A program where MVHS Junior and Senior students may spend one or two full years combining high school and college coursework at a local community college.
- Freestyle Academy: A two-year, interdisciplinary, project-focused, college

 Juniors and Seniors. Students take courses in English (AP/Honors not


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

Observations and Take-Aways: District-wide Progress Report

Overall, we take great pride in the strides we've achieved. We have not only met but also exceeded 50% of our goals, and we are approaching the remaining ones closely. Below are observations and key takeaways related to some of our indicator goals:

SBAC:

Although our SBAC-ELA scores for Exceeded/Met have shown improvement or stability across various groups, we have observed a decline in Math scores, particularly among Latinex, African American, and Other populations. Currently, neither the state nor the county has released the average CAASPP scores.

UC/CSU a-g:

UC a-g completion rates have increased this 2022-23 school year. This is consistent across almost all groups.

Algebra II Completion Rates:

Starting in 2020-21, our Algebra II completion data only includes students who graduated within four years and are not in Special Day Classes (SDC). Overall, there is an increase in the percentage of students completing Algebra II with a grade of C or higher. There remains some room for further enhancement to reach our Target Goal.

Advanced Placement:

For the 2022-2023 school year, MVLA has reached a significant milestone by having the highest percentage of Advanced Placement test takers. Furthermore, we have succeeded in increasing the percentage of exams with a score of 3 or better across the entire district. It is worth highlighting that we are also observing notable improvements in certain special populations, including AVID participants and our reclassified Fluent English proficiency students. These achievements reflect our ongoing commitment to excellence and inclusivity in education.

Freshman GPA 2.0+:

A freshman with a GPA of 2.0 or higher will likely set a course toward fulfilling graduation requirements in good standing. Conversely, finishing the freshman year with a GPA below 2.0 may indicate potential difficulties that could lead to issues related to attendance and academic performance, among other concerns. Our data for the 2022-2023 academic year reveals significant improvements in our freshman population, particularly in the category of those with a GPA of 2.0 or higher. This trend is a positive development for our students and bodes well for their educational journeys.


Graduation Rate:

One indicator where we've observed a small decline is in our graduation rates. In comparison to the 2021-2022 school year, there has been a 2% decrease in our graduation rates for the 2022-2023 school year. However, it's important to note that this year's graduation rate remains consistent with the rates we have maintained over the previous four years, from 2017 to 2021.







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CAASPP / SBAC / CAST Testing

The California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) is a statewide summative test evaluating students' proficiency in English Language Arts (ELA), Math, and Science. Our MVLA 11th-grade students undertake the CAASPP/SBAC and our 12th-grade students undertake the CAASPP science test (CAST) in the Spring. CAASPP testing plays a pivotal role in our educational ecosystem, offering insights into student learning and achievement. It serves not only as a benchmark for individual and collective academic progress but also as a tool to tailor strategies to better serve our students. The CAASPP 11th-grade assessments covers examples of the following:

SBAC ELA: The 11th-grade ELA test assesses students in reading, writing, listening, and research/inquiry skills. Questions focus on comprehension of complex texts, use of evidence to support analysis, understanding and critique of arguments, and effective communication of ideas through writing.

SBAC Math: This math test covers key concepts from high school mathematics, such as algebra, functions, geometry, and statistics. Students are assessed on their ability to solve problems, analyze and interpret data, and demonstrate mathematical reasoning.

CAST (Science): The CAST is aligned with the California Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) and covers life sciences, earth and space sciences, and physical sciences. It emphasizes scientific inquiry, investigation, and understanding of real-world phenomena.

The data derived from CAASPP assessments is invaluable, serving as a compass guiding MVLA in reviewing, planning, and implementing learning recovery and acceleration opportunities and reinforcing our commitment to equitable and inclusive instructional practices and student well-being.

Below is a description of the various tables displaying our CAASPP data:

Tables 1 & 2 (SBAC ELA and Match Claim Results): This set of tables displays our SBAC results by the four specific test claims in ELA ((1) Read Analytically, (2) Write Effectively, (3) Speak & Listen Purposefully, and (4) Conduct Research), and the three tested claims in math ((1) Concepts & Procedures, (2) Problem Solving, and Modeling & Data Analysis (3) Communicating Reasoning), across six years. A reminder that due to COVID, SBAC was not administered in 2020.

These categories were identified by using the distance a student's performance on the questions related to that claim from the Level 3 "Standard Met" achievement level criterion. The claim achievement category indicates that the score on a claim is one of the following:

- If the scale score of a claim is above the "Standard Met" achievement level on the total content-area test, the achievement category for the claim is "Above Standard".
- If the scale score of a claim is at or near the "Standard Met" achievement level on the total content-area test, the achievement category for the claim is "Near Standard".
- If the scale score of a claim is below the "Standard Met" achievement level on the total content-area test, the achievement category for the claim is "Below Standard".

Tables 3 & 4 (SBAC Comparison of Students Exceeding/Meeting Standards): These charts visualize how MVLA students compare to the county and state. We exceed country and state scores in every single ethnicity group.

Tables 5 - 8 (SBAC Comparison of Student Scores in 8th Grade versus 11th Grade): These charts compare to their 8th-grade SBAC test results. It's essential to highlight that while a significant portion of this student cohort remains consistent, there is attrition among those who took the test in 8th grade but are no longer part of the district. Additionally, there are students who were not enrolled in the district during 8th grade but have since joined.


Tables 9 - 10 (SBAC Comparison MVLV and Neighboring Districts): These charts show MVLA and four of our neighboring districts in overall achievement on SBAC across a six-year span.

Table 11 (Gain/Loss Report): This table shows the progress MVLA has made since we first started to administer the SBAC test. These tables include data on all students' averages and are broken down by ethnicity and program.

Table 12 (CAST Claim Results): Newly added to this binder is the most recent CAASPP test released, the California Science Test (CAST). The CAST is given to all seniors. The tables in this section show how our seniors scored in the three claims. The claims are LIFE SCIENCES: Focusing on structures and processes in living things, ecosystems, heredity, and biological evolution; PHYSICAL SCIENCES: Focusing on matter and its interactions, motion and stability, energy, and waves and their applications; and EARTH AND SPACE SCIENCES: Focusing on Earth's place in the universe, Earth's systems, and Earth and human activity.









2024 Advanced Placement Results

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: The Advanced Placement (AP) program, administered by the College Board, encompasses a total of 38 different exams available to high school students attending schools with robust college preparatory curricula. At MVHS, students were tested in 22 different subject areas. Scores of three, four, and five on an AP exam generally qualify students for college credit or advanced placement upon entering college, although individual college policies may vary. A score of four or five is often considered equivalent to earning an "A" grade in an introductory college course, while a score of three is similar to a "B" grade at the college level.

According to the College Board, grades of two and one should not be viewed as poor performance by either the student or the school. Instead, these scores are seen as indicators that the school is providing access to AP courses for an appropriate range of students. The College Board recommends that schools with AP passing rates exceeding the national average (usually around 60%) by a significant margin should find ways to involve more capable students in the program. In recent years, MVLA has consistently achieved passing rates of 80% or higher, and we take great pride in our increasing participation rates, with over 60% of students taking one or more AP tests this spring when calculated across the total 10-12 enrollment in the district.

Increasing enrollment and exam participation among Latino and Socially Economically Disadvantaged (SED) students has been a long-standing focus for our district. While progress has been made, work remains to be done. In line with the College Board and university admissions counselors, we firmly believe that students benefit greatly from challenging themselves with the most rigorous courses available, and success in AP is considered a strong predictor of college success. Therefore, we continue to strive for increased diverse enrollment in Honors and AP courses, expecting students in these classes to also sit for the exams. The experience of being in a challenging class alongside other motivated and engaged peers enhances a student's educational journey and provides a solid foundation for success in college. Additionally, there are inherent benefits in taking academically rigorous exams, regardless of the score obtained.

Our district has a history of offering AP courses and exams in various subjects, and we take great pride in our 24-year tradition of strong student performance on AP exams and the steady growth of our program.

REPORT/PROPOSAL: Below is a description of the various tables displaying our AP data:

Table 1 (Longitudinal Chart of AP scores tracked by score level): This longitudinal chart shows AP scores over a series of years, organized by score level (e.g., 1, 2, 3, 4, 5). It also give total enrollment and number of test-takers for reference. The table illustrates trends in the distribution of scores, allowing viewers to observe changes in the proportion of students achieving each score over time. This data can highlight patterns, such as increases in higher scores or shifts in performance across score levels, providing insights into the overall progression and performance of students in AP exams across the tracked years.

Table 2 (AP Test Results): This table provides an overview of AP performance metrics for a school or district. This table provides a snapshot of AP participation and performance, offering insights into student success rates and alignment with broader educational standards. The table details our the following data points::

- Enrollment: Total student enrollment.
- AP Seats: The number of AP course enrollments.
- AP Testers: The number of students taking AP exams.
- **Exams Administered**: The total AP exams taken.
- Exams with Scores of 3 or Higher: Number of exams achieving a passing score (3+).
- % of Exams with 3 or Higher: The percentage of exams with passing scores, with comparisons to state and national averages.

Table 3 (6-Year Change in Enrollment vs AP Participation): This table shows trends in both overall student enrollment and AP course engagement over a six-year period. This table highlights whether AP participation has kept pace with, exceeded, or lagged behind overall enrollment changes, providing insight into shifts in academic rigor and student engagement in advanced coursework over time.

Table 4 (Demographic characteristics of AP test takers): This table outlines the composition of students taking AP exams, broken down by key race/ethnicity demographic factors. By examining these characteristics, the table provides insight into the diversity of students participating in AP courses, helping to identify trends in access and representation within advanced academic programs.

Table 5 (6-Year Summary of AP Scholar Report): Six years ago, the College Board began publishing an AP Scholars Report. The definition of the various levels of AP Scholars is below and on the bottom of Table 5. We continue to have an increase in our total number of scholars.

We believe knowing this data supports us in data-driven decisions and serves as a compass as to where we focus our efforts.


