

## Mountain View Los Altos High School District 2022 Title I Waiver to Support Alta Vista High School's School-Wide Program Plan

The purpose of a School-Wide Program Plan (SWP) is to improve academic achievement throughout a school so that all students, particularly the lowest-achieving students, demonstrate proficiency on the State's academic standards (34 Code of Federal Regulations [CFR] 200.25[a][1]). The improved achievement is to result from improving the entire educational program of Alta Vista High School (34 CFR 200.25[a][2]).

Alta Vista High School conducted a comprehensive needs assessment of the entire school which was based on academic information about all students in Alta Vista High School, including all groups and migratory children, particularly the needs of those students who are failing, or are at-risk of failing, to meet the challenging State academic standards and any other factors as determined by the LEA, and particularly for those students furthest away from demonstrating proficiency, so that all students demonstrate at least proficiency on the State's academic standards (ESSA Section 1114[b][6]; 34 CFR 200.26[a][1] and [b]). The need assessment was conducted to: help Alta Vista High School understand the subjects and skills for which teaching and learning need to be improved (34 CFR 200.26[a][1][i][A]); and identify the specific academic needs of students and groups of students who are not yet achieving the State's academic standards (34 CFR 200.26[a][1][i][B]).

Continuing to operate a schoolwide program is the best way to serve the needs of the students at Alta Vista High School and to improve the academic achievement of all students as well as other factors (ESSA Section 1114[a][1][B]).

The SWP may consolidate funds from Federal, State, and local sources to implement Alta Vista High School's comprehensive plan to upgrade its entire educational program (ESSA Section 1114[a][1]; ESSA Section 1114[a][3][A]-[B]; 34 CFR 200.25[e]; 34 CFR Section 200.29[a]).

Alta Vista High School for the 2021-2022 school year did not meet the forty percent (40%) threshold for implementing a schoolwide program; however, more than twenty-five percent (25%) of the students are low income.

The District has determined that the best way to serve the student population is to continue to implement a schoolwide program that includes a comprehensive strategy for improving the whole school so that every student achieves high levels of academic proficiency.

The Schoolwide Program plan requirements are included in Alta Vista High School's School Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA).

The Governing Board of the Mountain View Los Altos High School District desires to waive the forty percent threshold in order to implement the School Wide Program at Alta Vista High School.
