# **10.2 Presentation on Potential Expanded Scope of Measure E - Gym Modernization Projects**

At the September 9, 2024 board study session, district staff provided an update of current and future Measure E projects, including the gym modernization projects at both Los Altos High School and Mountain View High School. At that meeting, the board provided direction to investigate expanding the scope of those two projects, as the original scope was based on the facilities assessment conducted in 2016. The architect firm and construction management team were tasked with exploring and providing conceptual details of an expanded scope and cost estimates. Representatives from Quattrocchi Kwok Architects (QKA) and district staff will share the expanded scope concepts, estimated costs and current funding available.

Associate Superintendent, Mike Mathiesen discussed the project scope of Measure E from nine years ago and taking a fresh look at the site gyms. He then introduced representatives from the Cumming Group who gave a presentation on potential updated plans for the modernization of the LAHS and MVHS Gyms.

# 11.6 Contract Amendment #3 Between Mountain View Los Altos High School District and Quattrocchi Kwok Architects, Inc. (QKA) to Provide Services Related to the Los Altos High School Cafeteria Building Modernization Project

Mountain View Los Altos High School District is requesting approval of Contract Amendment #3 with Quattrocchi Kwok Architects, Inc (QKA): The design fee is dependent upon the construction cost basis, per the Owner Architect Agreement. The current construction estimate has increased to \$5,150,597.00 from 3,344,000.00 resulting in an increase to the design fee in the amount of \$180,660.00. The amendment also includes \$4,400 for title 24 energy work and \$9,375 for mechanical consultant to address DSA comments on existing main and branch piping within the building, these services were not included in original scope of work and are considered Extra Services per the Owner Architect Agreement. ### 11.9 Declaration of Sale or Disposal of Surplus Property
