Summer School Purpose

- Helps more of our students graduate on time
- Allows more students to graduate A-G eligible
- For our students with IEPs and Extended School Year Services, summer school is crucial to prevent the regression of skills learned during the year



Stats on This Year's Summer School

- 50+ Staff Members Teachers, Paraprofessionals, Therapists, Etc.
- 18 Classes including A-G core content classes, Special Education support classes (incoming grade 9- Adult Transition Program) and Credit Recovery for graduating seniors

Thank you to Dr. Latina Wharton and Michael Rasmussen who helped make it possible for <u>16</u> <u>students to be summer graduates</u>.

The pilot of a Credit Recovery Model was very successful. This Model allowed the district to offer partial credits across various subject areas to seniors who would otherwise need to return for a 5th year.

Impact on Alta Vista's Graduation Rate:

★ 2021-2022 Graduation rate without credit recovery option: 59%

★ Actual 2021-2022 Graduation rate: 71%


