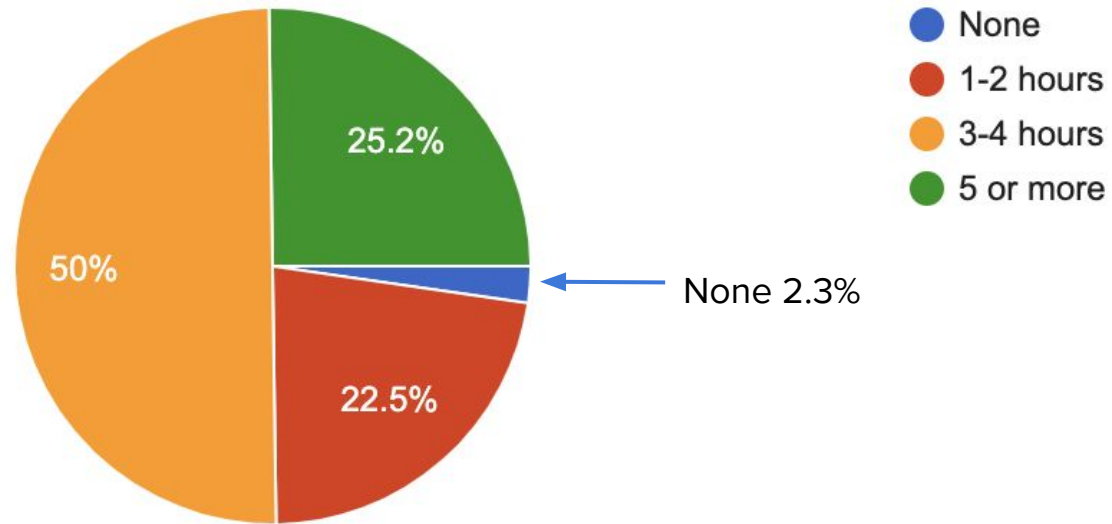

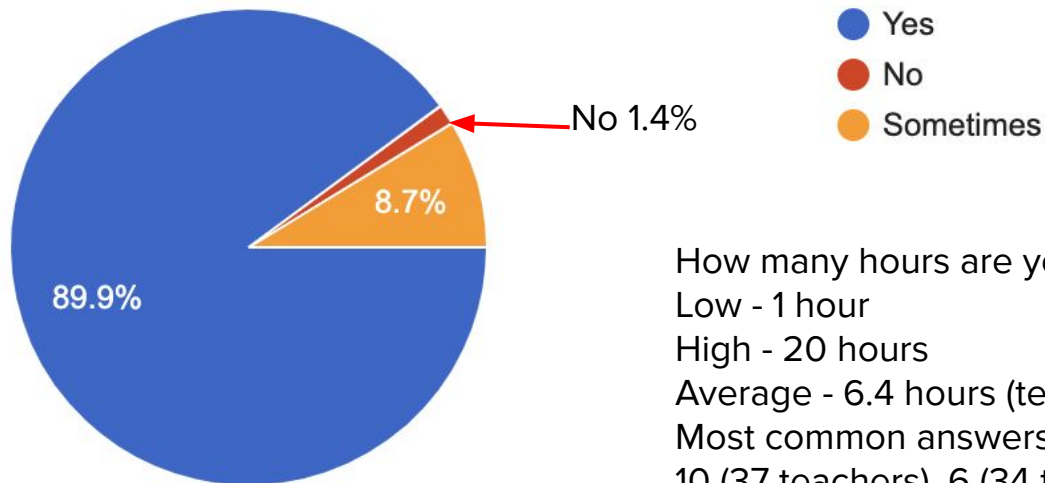
Beyond the teaching hours from 8:30 - 3:45, how many hours are you working each weekday?

Average - 6.4 hours (teacher workday is 6.75)

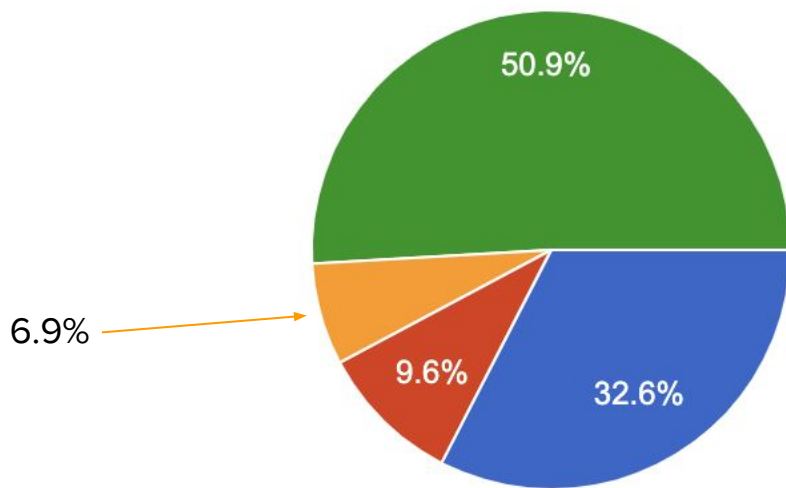
Most common answers -

Some comments from teachers - Canvas

Pro

- I am exclusively using Canvas to benefit students by only using one platform.
- As I have time to figure out and troubleshoot Canvas, I am adding more. Also as students become more aware/used to Canvas.
- I'm using Canvas more and more. I may be able to switch 100% by next year. I'm learning something new every week.
- Canvas has a steep learning curve, and lots of little options that make it easy to make mistakes. But it does everything I need it to. It takes time, but my courses are much better organized than they would have been without it.

Con

- It's a lot to learn and process on our own. Even with tech support, setting things up take a long time.
- It is extremely time consuming but I'd rather have one platform (Canvas) instead of two at the same time.
- I have dived head first into Canvas. It has been challenging. I strongly suggest a multi year integration model in the future-- a year of training with access, a year with expectation of use and more training, then a full implementation.
- CANVAS is slowly killing me. Why did we do this to ourselves or the kids? 2nd semester if we are back to school, ok. Now it's insane.

Pro

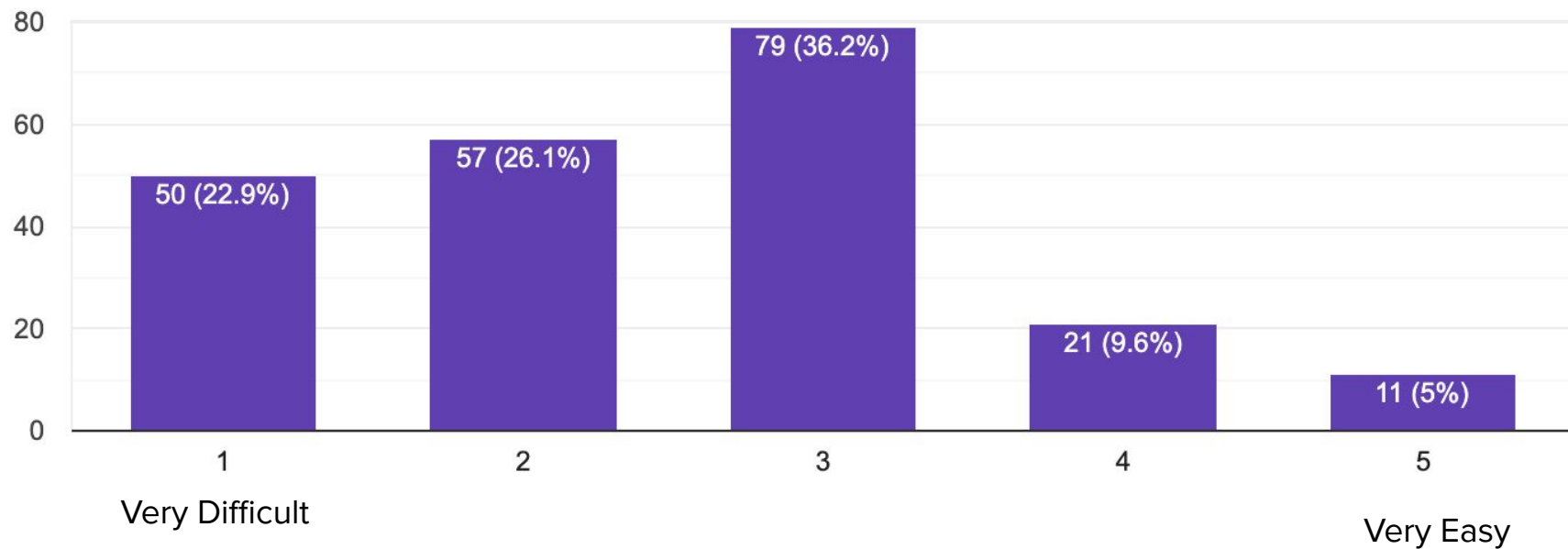
- I'm mostly using GC. I want to learn Canvas though and will try to make the switch later this year...but the bugs need worked out to make it worth it to me.
- I prefer using Google Classroom because I am more familiar with it. With Distance Learning, I have enough on my plate already without adding learning a new LMS.

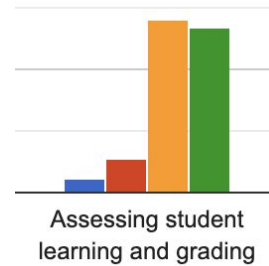
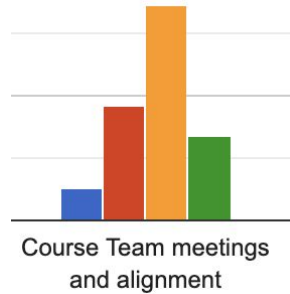
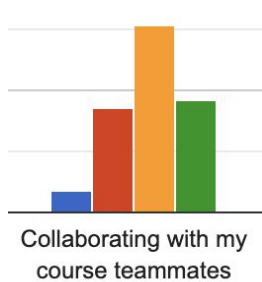
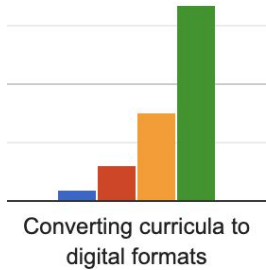
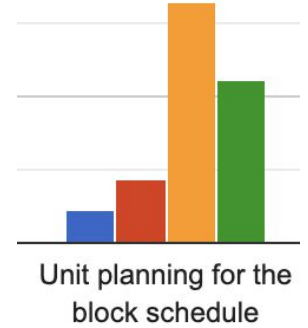
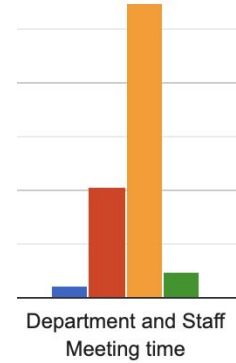
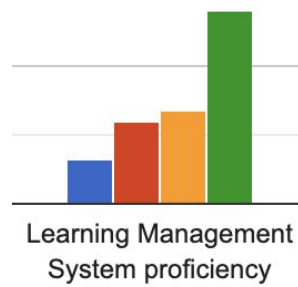
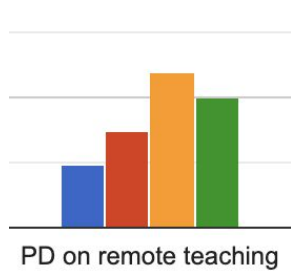
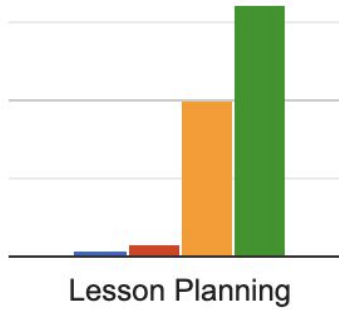
- I don't even have a GC right now. A lot of effort has gone into teaching students how to use Canvas.

When you're not delivering instruction, how is your time spent (Exclude Wednesday)

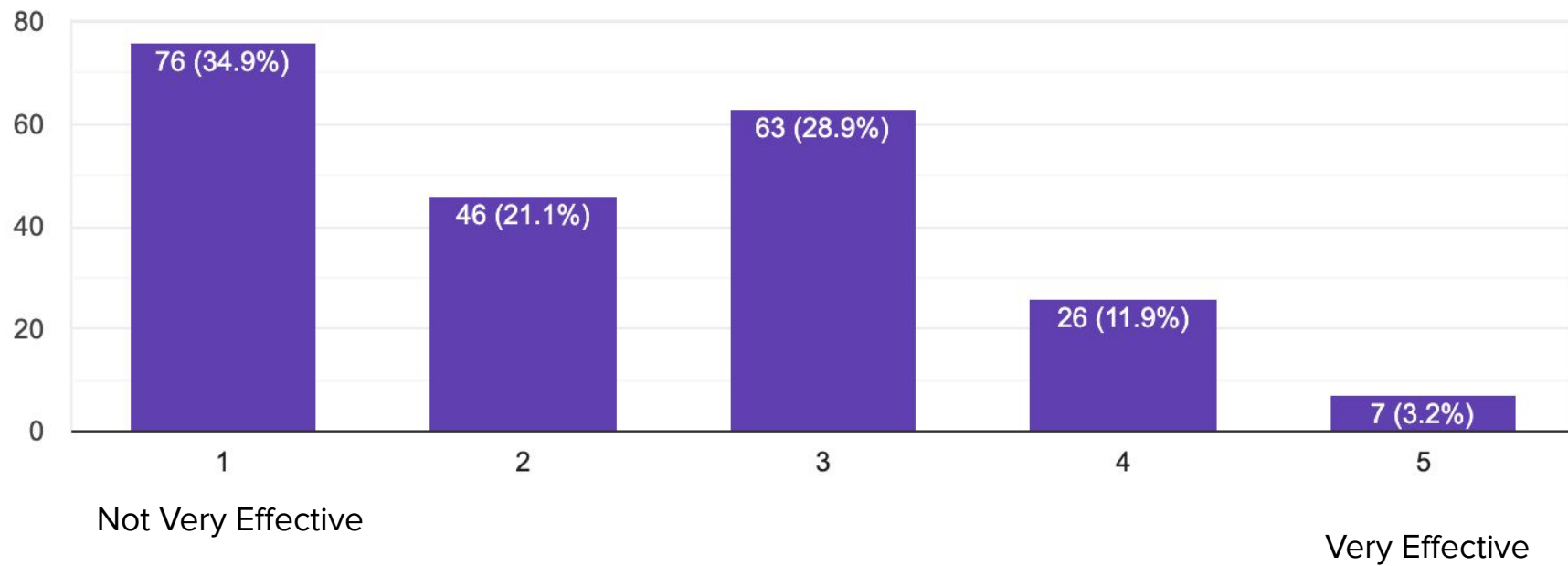


How are you using your Wednesdays?



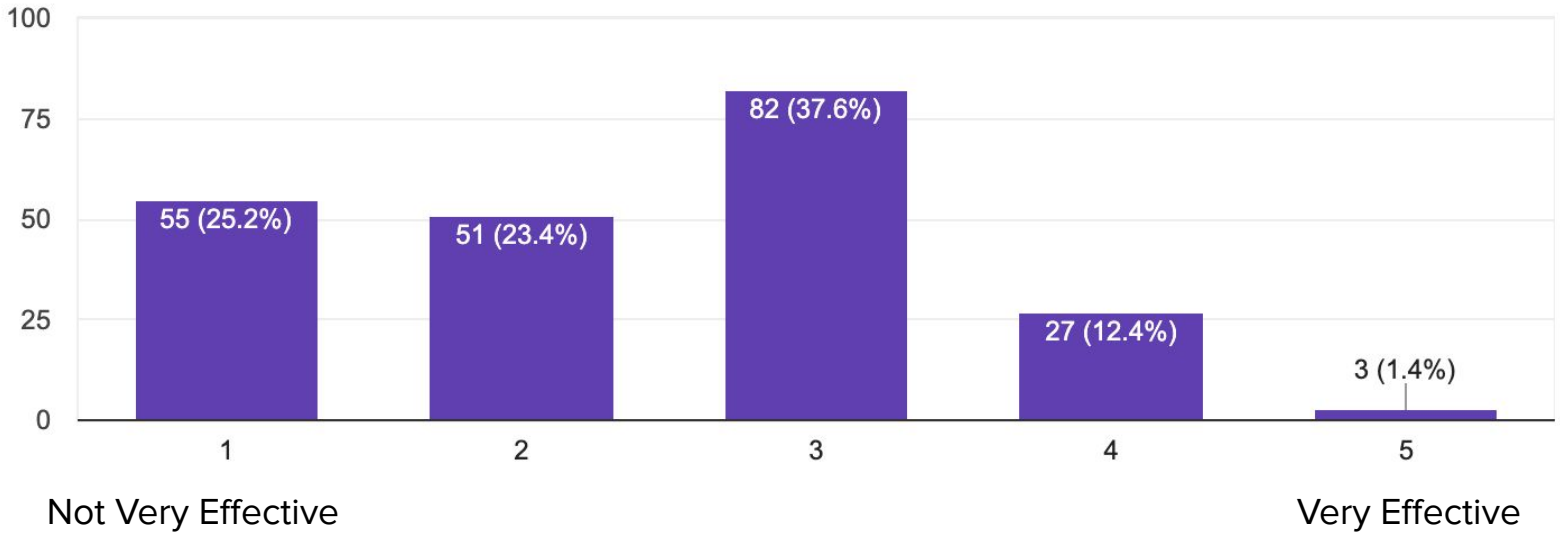
How effective has the slate been for you?

How effective has the slate been for your students?

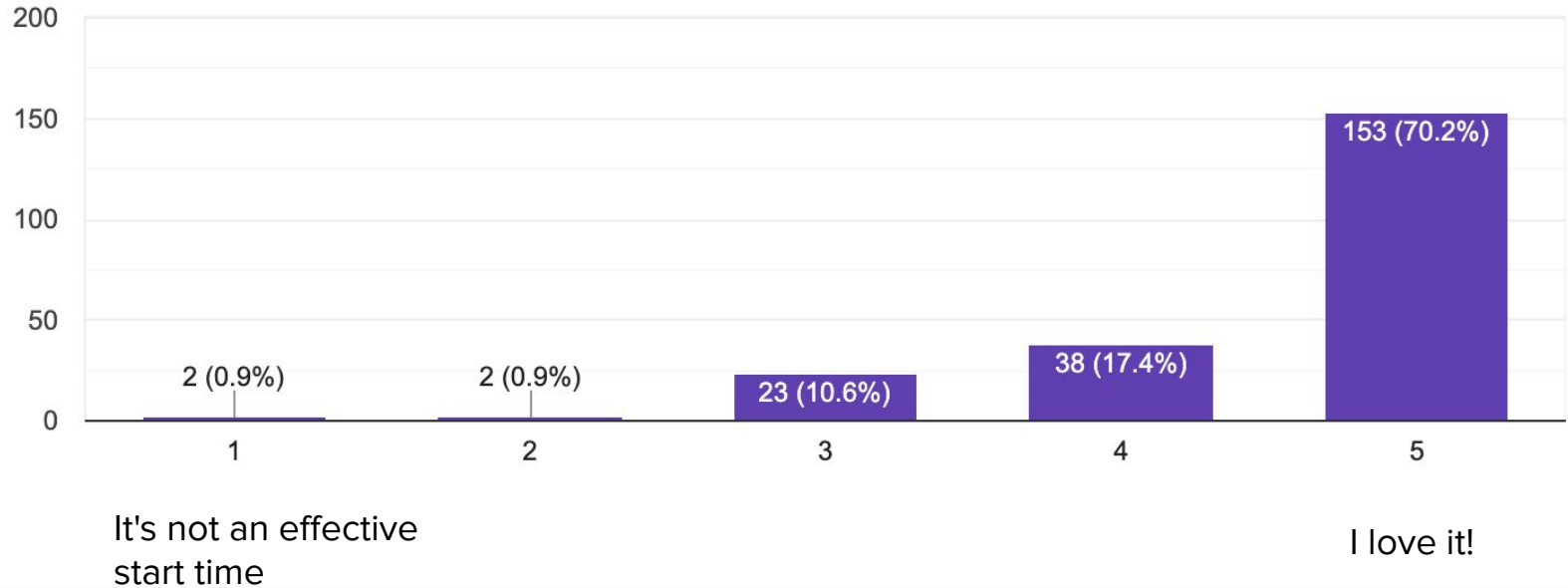

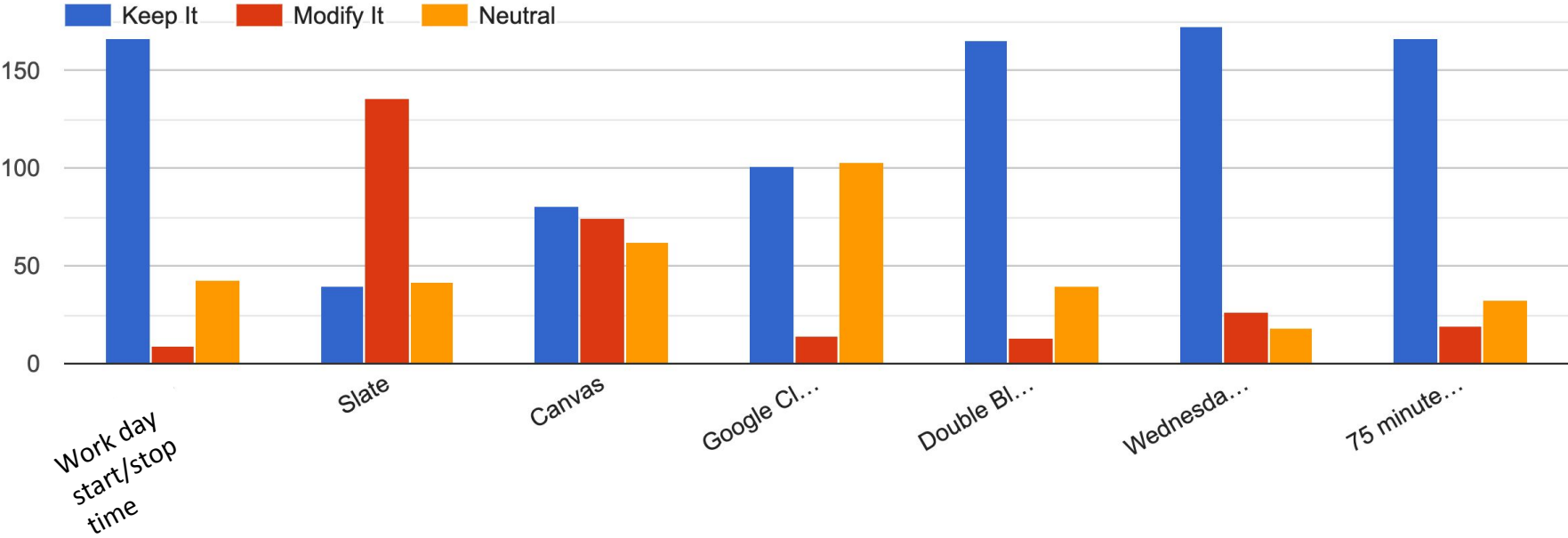
How do you like the 9:30 start time?
