## Superintendent's Report

# 13.1 Superintendent's Report

Superintendent Dr. Nellie Meyer reported that she's visited the school campuses over the past two weeks and noted that activities, events, and projects are at their peak. Dr. Meyer shared an update on COVID testing within the county and the recent changes in relation to spectators, which positively impact both our sports and art programs. Dr. Meyer reported on the shifts made at the state level over the last several weeks.

Other highlights in Dr. Meyer's presentation included:

- PTSA meetings at both comprehensive sites; Dr. Meyer noted that Trustee Torok spoke about the construction projects and new fields.
- The next Brown Bag session will be on Ethnic Studies, followed by College & Career Exploration.
- Luis Versalles (Courageous Conversations) recently presented to our internal equity team.
- The next Parent Speaker Series event will be held on February 1, 2022, with presenter Rosetta Lee speaking on implicit and unconscious bias.
- The ASB (Associated Student Body), the Ambassadors, and the school administration partnered on a wonderful pep rally at Mountain View High School.
- Dr. Meyer acknowledged the Trustees for their difficult work and noted that January 2022 is School Board Recognition Month (CSBA-California School Boards Association).

President Vonnegut pulled this item to acknowledge the retirement of Bill Pierce, Principal and Director of Alternative Programs. Dr. Meyer and the trustees shared their appreciation for Mr. Pierce's dedication and work during his time with the district.

Dr. Meyer introduced and welcomed Tim Lugo, new Athletic Director at Mountain View High School.

President Vonnegut acknowledged that the Personnel Report contained language to increase the pay for MVLA substitutes through the end of the 21-22 school year to assist with pandemic staffing needs.

D. Torok Moved; F. Walter Seconded, and the Board of Trustees voted 5-0-0 (with two Preferential Ayes by student representatives) to approve the Personnel Report.

### **Business/Action Items**

## 18.1 MVLA Community Outreach and Engagement Update

Community Outreach Coordinator, Michelle Bissonnette, gave an overview of the outreach she has conducted since the beginning of the school year and shared feedback from students, parents, and the community. She shared the newly redesigned district website and introduced the new district phone app.

Ms. Bissonnette reported on the newly formed Family Partnership Council – sharing the background and rationale for developing this advisory group; and shared her objectives for engagement during the second semester.

### 18.2 English Language Development Program at Los Altos High School – Presentation

Teri Faught, Associate Superintendent of Educational Services, gave a presentation and proposed an English Development Program be developed at Los Altos High School beginning with the 2022/2023 school year. Teri Faught and Dr. Meyer answered questions posed by trustees.

F. Walter Moved; D. Torok Seconded, and the Board of Trustees voted 5-0-0 (with two Preferential Ayes by student representatives) to approve the addition of a minimum of ELD 1-4 classes and other EL content courses (depending on enrollment) up to \$320,000 in funds. This program will grow according to identified student need, with more EL courses and supports.

18.3 <u>Proposed New Board Policy and Administrative Regulation: Gender Identity and Access - First Reading</u> Teri Faught, Associate Superintendent of Educational Services, introduced the draft of a new Board Policy and Administrative Regulation on Gender Identity and Access and answered questions posed by trustees during the first reading of the proposed language. Suggested language changes by trustees were noted.

### 18.4 2022-2023 Academic Calendar

Leyla Benson, Associate Superintendent of Personnel, provided an overview of significant dates within the proposed 2022-2023 academic calendar. This calendar was voted upon and approved by the DTA (District Teachers Association).

S. Dave Moved to pull the item to further study the number of minutes and days. There was no Second noted - Motion failed.

F. Walter Moved; D. Torok Seconded, and the Board of Trustees voted 4-1-0 (with S. Dave dissenting; and with two Preferential Ayes by student representatives) to approve the 2022-2023 academic calendar.
