## **Summer School Objectives**

- Help more of our students graduate on time
- Allow more students to graduate CSU/UC eligible
- For our students with IEPs and Extended School Year Services, summer school is crucial to prevent the regression of skills learned during the year



# 2023 Highlights

Greater Inclusion: "opt-out" instead of "opt-in" with site guidance for courses needed

**Streamlined scheduling**: Counselor guidance from SS admin on course selection & Aeries sign-ups; eliminating redundant forms/Excels

**Districtwide** AVID Bridge, Prep for HS, and Summer Academy classes for incoming 9th

ELD Intensive Literature is now **ELD English credits** (versus elective)

Summer grad numbers are going strong - LAHS, MVHS and AVHS sending seniors

Alternative Education recruiting during summer in every classroom informed students about AVHS, Freestyle, College Now and Middle College

## **Stats on This Year's Summer School**

- 50+ Staff Members Teachers, Paraprofessionals, Therapists, etc.
- 23 courses & 35 Sections Offered including college prep core content classes, Special Education core and support classes (incoming grade 9-Adult Transition Program) and Credit Recovery for potential summer graduates
