  - Information provided will assist in identifying strengths, weaknesses and areas in need of improvement for local educational agencies and schools

- Annual assessments

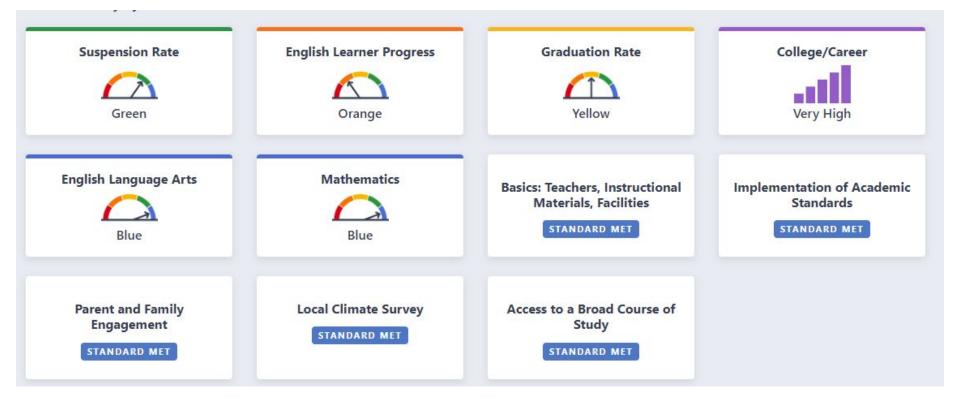
