Face to Face Service Outpatient Hourly Services	<b>Counseling and Guidance/ MH Rehabilitation</b>  “Counseling and Guidance” means a service activity which includes, but is not limited to assistance in improving, maintaining, or restoring a beneficiary’s or group of beneficiaries’ functional skills, daily living skills, social and leisure skills, grooming and personal hygiene skills, meal preparation skills, and support resources; and /or medication education.	\$196.80 Hourly (\$3.28/Minute)
	<b>Intensive Home Based Services (IHBS)</b>  IHBS are intensive, individualized and strength-based, needs-driven intervention activities that support the engagement and participation of the child/youth and his/her significant support persons and to help the child/youth develop skills and achieve the goals and objectives of the plan. IHBS are not traditional therapeutic services.	\$196.80 Hourly (\$3.28/Minute)
	<b>Individual and Group Counseling/ MH Therapy</b>  “Individual and Group Counseling” means a service activity which is a therapeutic intervention that focuses primarily on symptoms reduction as a means to improve functional impairments. Individual and Group Counseling may be delivered to an individual or group of beneficiaries and may include family therapy at which the beneficiary is present.	\$196.80 Hourly (\$3.28/Minute)
	<b>Social Work/ MH Case Management/Environmental Modification</b>  “Social Work” means services that assist a beneficiary to access needed medical, educational, social, prevocational, vocational, rehabilitative, or other community services. The service activities may include, but are not limited to, communication, coordination, and referral; monitoring service delivery to ensure beneficiary access to service and the service delivery system; monitoring of the beneficiary’s progress; placement services; and plan development.	\$152.40 Hourly (\$2.54/Minute)

STRTP/Hospital Diversion	<b>Parent Counseling/ MH Collateral</b>	“Parent Counseling” means a service activity to a significant support person in a beneficiary’s life for the purpose of meeting the needs of the beneficiary in terms of achieving the goals of the beneficiary’s client plan. Parent counseling may include but is not limited to consultation and training of the significant support person(s) to assist in better utilization of specialty mental health services by the beneficiary, consultation and training of the significant support person(s) to assist in better understanding of mental illness, and family counseling with the significant support person(s).	\$196.80 Hourly (\$3.28/Minute)
	<b>Psychological/ MH Assessments</b>	“Psychological Assessment” means a service activity which may include a clinical analysis of the history and current status of a beneficiary’s mental, emotional, or behavioral disorder; relevant cultural issues and history; diagnosis; and the use of testing procedures.	\$196.80 Hourly (\$3.28/Minute)
	<b>Behavior Intervention/MH Therapeutic Behavior Services</b>	“Behavioral Intervention” is an intensive, individualized, one to one, short-term, intervention for students up to age 21 with serious emotional disturbances (SED) who are experiencing a stressful transition or life crisis and need additional short-term specific support services to accomplish outcomes specified in the written treatment plan.	\$196.80 Hourly (\$3.28/Minute)
	<b>Crisis Intervention</b>	Crisis Intervention (CI) is an immediate emergency response that is intended to help the client cope with a crisis (e.g., potential danger to self or others; potentially life altering event; severe reaction that is above the client’s normal baseline, etc.).	\$292.20 Hourly (\$4.87/Minute)
	<b>Medication Support</b>	“Medication Management” means Board Certified Psychiatric Services for Medication Assessment and Management.	\$363.60 Hourly (\$6.06/Minute)
	<b>One to One Support</b>	One to One support; means a dedicated staff member is within one arm’s length of the client to maintain the safety of well-being of the clients and other in acute stages of their treatment. This preventative approach is to maintain the client at a current level of care during the elevation stages of acute behaviors. Typically, this service is done in a Short Term Residential Therapeutic Program (STRTP) or Inpatient settings.	\$45 Hourly
	<b>Intensive Outpatient</b>	“Intensive Outpatient” (IOP) means a structured, multi-disciplinary program of group therapies to an alternative inpatient hospitalization. Activities include group therapies, with psychiatric support during a 4-hour structured time frame. Service are usually after school and may include, but are not limited to, assessment, plan development, therapy, rehabilitation and collateral	\$400 Daily

	<b>Partial Hospital Diversion</b>	The RCS Partial Hospital Diversion Program is a voluntary, temporary therapeutic outpatient setting. It offers an alternative to inpatient hospitalization for a wide range of at-risk youth who are capable of functioning in an unlocked setting. Services are usually during the morning and afternoon hours of the day that include a structured milieu setting with psychiatric and therapy support.	\$650 Daily
	<b>Hospital Diversion Semi-Private</b>	The RCS Hospital Diversion Program is a voluntary, temporary therapeutic residential environment in a community setting. It offers an alternative to inpatient hospitalization for a wide range of at-risk youth who are capable of functioning in an unlocked setting. This program utilizes focused, goal-oriented treatment planning, stabilization and safety. It targets 8 onsite clients with a projected short length of stay.	\$1,000 Daily
	<b>Hospital Diversion – Private Room</b>	The RCS Hospital Diversion Program is a voluntary, temporary therapeutic residential environment in a community setting. It offers an alternative to inpatient hospitalization for a wide range of at-risk youth who are capable of functioning in an unlocked setting. This program utilizes focused, goal-oriented treatment planning, stabilization and safety. It targets 8 onsite clients with a projected short length of stay.	\$1,500 Daily
<b>Group Services</b>	<b>Prevention &amp; Education</b>	Parenting Skills Workshops -(Up to 30 parents per workshop) Parenting Instructors deliver evidence-based curriculum to develop positive parenting skills in a group setting. Evidence-based childcare is included, and workshops are available in English and Spanish.	\$12,000 per 10 weeks
		School-based Small Groups -(6-8 students per group)Facilitators use evidence-based curriculum to target the specific needs of a small group of students. Topics include Life Skills, Character Education and Social Skills, Drug and Alcohol Prevention, and Kindergarten-Readiness.	\$2,500 per 10 weeks
		Whole-Class Instruction–Facilitators deliver evidence-based curriculum to an entire class of students. Topics include Life Skills, Character Education and Social Skills, Drug and Alcohol Prevention, and Kindergarten-Readiness.	\$3,500 per 10 weeks
		Trauma-Informed Clinical Parenting Workshops - This series helps parents to develop and implement positive parenting strategies to support their students at home and in school. Topics include managing stress and anxiety related to COVID-19; processing grief; implementing self-care; supporting their students transition back to school; identifying worries	\$2800 for four weeks Or \$4200 for six weeks

		and how to support their students; communication and practical routines; empowering strategies vs. what to avoid.	
		Culinary Arts-An in person or virtual course in Culinary Arts designed to prepare youth, ages 15-25, for a career in the hospitality industry. Students are trained in all aspects of the culinary arts including knife skills, safety and sanitation, kitchen measurement, an introduction to baking, meats and pastas, team building, job readiness, and self-esteem and self-discipline building skills. Typically, a 10-week course; up to 15 students per workshop. Option to include education in substance use and abuse prevention.	\$15,900 per 10 weeks or \$795 per session
		Family Skill-Building Culinary Class- Chef Carlos Pineda and the RCS Culinary Academy and Kneaded Bakery team guide students and their families through the creation of a recipe. Class covers introductions, sanitation and safety, guided instruction and Q&A. Classes are held virtually from the commercial kitchen at RCS. Class is 90 minutes. Population: Parents, students, family members.	\$795 (plus additional cost to cover food items for families)
		Clinical Parenting Workshops- (Up to 10 parents per workshop) Clinician delivers evidence-based curriculum to develop positive parenting skills in a group setting. Workshops are available in English and Spanish.	\$200 per hour \$350 per hour for two facilitators
Wraparound	<b>Wraparound</b>	“Wraparound” - Uses the family’s own strengths to help meet their needs & grow together through an intensive planning process that uses targeted interventions.	\$6,000 Monthly
Consultation	<b>Professional Consultation and Training</b>	Professional consultation and training designed to support the staff and organization needs of community-based organizations, schools, and other community partners.	\$200.00 Hourly
