WASC Progress Report to the Board

December 17, 2019

This year's Annual Review booklet has a different look, reflecting our attempt to make this presentation more about the progress our schools are making on their WASC Goals, and showing the important congruence and coherence between a number of required school plans.

The Western Association of Schools and Colleges (ACS-WASC), for the last few years has worked diligently with the California Department of Education (CDE) to align processes and procedures to enable schools to focus on **one single plan of action** that will result in significant school improvement. As such, there should be almost perfect alignment between a school district's Board Goals, the school's SPSA, and the district's LCAP. To arrive at this single ACTION PLAN, schools must engage in continuous reflection and examination of their students' academic performance, as well as engage in a thorough review and evaluation of programs, practices and operations to determine their effectiveness. Findings from this review will allow a school to focus its energy and resources on STUDENT LEARNING and ensure that their daily actions and operations positively impact STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT.



Purpose of this Report & Rationale for Change in Format

The resulting ACTION PLAN must reflect the findings from the assessment of student outcome data as well as findings from evaluating the effectiveness of programs, services to students and operational practices. The ACTION PLAN must have measurable goals, each of which must be designed to impact student learning and improve achievement.

The data and information assembled here show how our students are performing on a number of board-adopted indicators and how students access our curriculum, or better stated, who enroll in what classes, and how successful they are. Before we can measure student success, we must make sure that they are accessing our highly effective programs in an equitable manner. The information is intended to help our site administrators and school leadership teams to actively engage in a Cycle of Inquiry and Continuous Improvement. A review of our performance results at regular intervals enables us to assess the quality of our programs and services, gives us reason to celebrate our successes, and most importantly, it helps us focus our attention, and target our resources to where they are most needed.

Critical Learner Needs (based on data analysis)

Latin(x) student engagement and achievement is not at, or near parity based on the findings from our 2018/19 student performance data analysis

- 19% of Latin(x) students are involved in a co/extra curricular activity as compared to 38% of all students, and 45% of Caucasian students
- Latin(x) students' SBAC scores in ELA are currently only 6% higher than county averages, whereas the percentage for all LAHS students is 15% higher than all students in SCC.

- 55% of LAHS Latin(x) students *meet a-g requirements* as compared to 77% of all LAHS students, and 82% of all Caucasian students
- 73% of Latin(x) students complete Algebra II/IIH with a C or better, as compared to 90% of all LAHS students, and 94% of Caucasian students
- The proportion of Latin(x) students in
 Special Education is currently 17%. State averages are closer to 14%
- 37% of 9th Grade Latin(x) students earn a
 3.0 unweighted GPA as compared to 72% of all LAHS students, and 85% of Caucasians



Critical Learner Needs (based on data analysis)

- As many as 20 students experience school avoidance in any given year and do not return to healthy attendance patterns after more than a year or more of current efforts.
- Special Education representation in and *completion of CTE courses* is not meeting the level of need for students with IEPs.



Expected Improvement on Critical Learner Needs at the end of our 6-year WASC Cycle

Latin(x) students will show progress toward meeting LAHS' Schoolwide Learner Outcomes (SLOs) and meet or approach the following "Critical" Learner Targets:

- **35%** of Latin(x) students will be involved in an activity on campus (co/extra curricular)
- Latin(x) students will increase their SBAC scores in ELA and math to be **15%** higher than all test takers at the County level by 2025
- **70%** of Latin(x) students will meet a-g requirements by 2025
- The proportion of all Latin(x) subgroups earning a GPA of 3.0 at the end of their 9th grade will increase by **15%** from current level
- The proportion of Latin(x) students in Special Ed will be reduced to **10%** by 2025

- All students experiencing school avoidance will return to "normal" school attendance within a full year of being identified.
- Special Education representation in and completion of CTE courses will be at 85% of the Special Education population by 2025.




Los Altos High School CBEDS Enrollment October 2014-2019






Los Altos High School CBEDS Enrollment October 2014-2019



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
Los Altos High School Algebra II/IIH Completion with a C or Better

By Language & Time in US





(a-g Approved, AP + Honors Courses Only) by Class



STUDENT DISTRIBUTION ACROSS CURRICULUM

Special Notes:

- Each subject area is divided by Intervention classes, College Prep/a-g, Honors, and/or Advanced Placement, where applicable
- For grade level specific courses, data is calculated based on EOY enrollment in that course
- For courses that are open to students for a particular range of grade levels, data is calculated commensurate with the enrollment in those grade levels
- For courses that are open to students at all grade levels, data is calculated based on the EOY enrollment of the four grades combined
- GPAs in **red** is used to signal that the GPA of a particular group is approximately one half grade point below that of Caucasian students
- **Red** in general means "we know our students can do better", what will it take to help them improve their performance and access college preparatory curriculum and honors and AP classes in greater numbers
- A percentage greater than 100% means that some students are doubling up in a particular subject area
- Percentages are rounded






Mental Health Referrals - Quarter One




