

Legislative Update August 9, 2021

AB 104 Gonzalez) Pupil Retention

This month, Governor Newsom signed Assembly Bill 104 into law. The bill contained three major provisions: retention, grading, and graduation policies.

Components of the bill include:

- A process for students who were enrolled in grades K-11 for the 2020-2021 year to request to repeat the last grade
- A process for high school students to change eligible grades to Pass/No Pass.
- Exemption from district graduation requirements for students in grades 11 or 12 who were not on track to graduate

AB 130

Earlier this month, <u>Assembly Bill (AB) 130</u> was signed into law, requiring school districts to offer students an independent study option for the 2021-2022 school year, such as the "Option B" program created by MVLA last year to provide students and families an online independent study option during the COVID-19 pandemic. We will be offering it again in the 2021-2022 school year.

Some key points to note:

Option B is asynchronous learning in an independent study format that requires students to have the self-discipline and motivation to work successfully independently. For the 2021-2022 school year, Option B students and families must agree to a weekly synchronous instruction period.

Students enrolled in Option B will not take any classes at the site high school; this includes music classes, Freestyle, journalism/newspaper, AVID, etc.
